Signatories argued that you should maintain at possible, and do not add to it whenever an opinion is formed. Perhaps because I spend a lot of time listening to people with crazy opinions, I am sympathetic to the point that the only way to live a healthy intellectual life is to constantly expose themselves to strange or detestable opinions. But I never sign petitions or open letters. I told the organizers of the letter that if I have something to say, I will write my damn letter. Open letters are terrible and you should never write one or sign one. Yascha Mounk: Stop firing the innocent That's why the kind of open letters should die: They're wrong. They cannot bear traces of their individual authors, and the easiest way to rub those traces is to write in a numb, anonymized, idiosyncratic and ingenious style. (If you look for idiosyncrasia and wit, read the articles that my colleagues of the Atlantic who signed the letter to write under their names.) This process cancels the language, and the result in the case of Harper's letter is a prose cemetery, without a single pungent phrase or phrase worthy of quotation. Humour is particularly forbidden. Martin Amis signed the letter, but I read enough Amis to know that he would be called before God to answer alone for his style. They're open to doubt. What should we think of a letter signed by Martin Amis that could not be written by Martin Amis? I suppose an interpretation is "Amis really has to believe in this stuff, if he is willing to suppress his gag reflex on a cliche like all too common or we are already paying the price". Another more hostile interpretation is that the signatories —considered politically respectable, at least — they would never believe this stuff. therefore must have been deceived the letter, and others manipulated them for nefarious purposes. Emily VanDerWerff suggests that the letter contains "many dog whistles towards anti-transfer positions", and that these hateful messages were unheardable to many signatories (except, among others, by J. K. Rowling, who recently became a hated figure among the trans-slouchers, and Jesse Singal, who wrote a cover story about trans-related issues for this magazine). Others notice the presence of Bari Weiss, which, like a Columbia, did a graduation campaign against professors like Joseph Massad, who compared Israeli Jews to the Nazis. Surely these liberal lions would not have signed the letter if they knew that even a faux-liberal like Weiss was signing it? The suggestion that dozens of liberals "got played" by some allegedly illiberal tricks is ridiculous to me. Everyone reads and signs the same letter. However, the signatories had to spend their time defending the letter against the sins of some of its other signatories, and retaining speculations about the alleged integrity of others—instead of promoting its substance. No need. In 1931, after Albert Einstein's theory of relativity became famous, a booklet was published under the title "100 Authors Against Einstein answered: "Why 100? If they were right, it would be enough". One of the greatest pleasures of writing for the public is the pleasure of being right, and watching your readers resist to you before you are right. The smaller the minority in which the writer is located, the greater the pleasure of watching the audience slowly relent and joining her. Many writers on Harper's list know this pleasure. But longer the list less pleasure — and at some point, a writer must wonder why he would be concerned to sign as a name between the tens, when instead he mightthe greatest rewards of solitary justice. The most ignored open letters and petitions are those that do not require anything from the signatories - no time, no effort, no risk of reputation or life. That is why no one is particularly concerned with the counter-lettra circulating in response to Harper's letter. No one who signed that counter is in danger of anything, but congratulations from the left-wing comrades who signed it. I assume that the signatories will receive the usual e-mail flood from random losers filled with hatred, but not all of us? (Readers regularly email me to drop or kill myself. Harper's writers argue that a silent poison is permeating liberal institutions, unnoticed spreading as a carbon monoxide leak in magazines, newspapers and universities. That poison is the belief that closing your enemies' mouth is a victory for you. I associate this disappointment to the right, and see that the seep on the left is creepy. You want your enemies to constantly probe your defenses, exposing your weaknesses, and reminding you to strengthen them.
