Part of its structure is now in the cathedral of Syracuse. Delos Temple of Apollo, Delos (470 BC) Hexastyle Peripteral Dópteric Building, now largely in ruin. Temple of Hera Lacinia, Agrigento, Sicily (460 BC) Temple Dórico Bullided southeast of Agrigento. Rises, along with the temple of Concordion, the Temple of Zeus Olómpia and others, in the Valley of the Temples. Temple of Zeus, Olympia (460 BC) Temple Dópteral Dópteral Hexastyle, designed by Libon de Elis. Temple on the Iliissus, Athens (449 BC) A small Ionic Amphiprostyle Tethrasytl Temple next to the Iliissus River, designed by the Callicrates Greek architect. For the main Greek Sculptors of the Século 5, see: Myron (FL 480-444 BC.), Polykleitos, known for his statue of ivy, and Calamaco (FL 432-408 BC.). Hefesto Temple, Athens (449 BC) also called Theseion, this exceptionally well preserved hexastyle peripteral Dótrico Building now acts as an orthodox church. The Parthenon, Athens Acropole (447-432 BC) The largest doric temple of Athens Acrypole, and the work per excellence of the Greek high classical architecture, remains one of the most influential and ionic buildings in the world. Building for Pania by ICTINUS and Callicrates architects, and carved under the direction of fiveness, which personally created its huge statue Chryselephantine cult of Athena, is based on an octyle land plan peripheral. Although its pedimental sculpture and allant metope is placed out in the dutric style, it also has an ionic style frieze that surrounds the building. Tholos of Athena, Delphi (400 BC) a circular temple - with a doric exterior and a Corinthian interior - built by Phocea Teodoros. Temple of Asclepius, Epidaurus (380 ECB) Doric Hexastyle Builder designed by Theodotus, with pedimental sculpture by timotheos. Temple of Artemis, % feso, SIA Minor (356 ECB) Octastyle Temple IÁ ±nico designed by Greek architects DemÁ ^o Trio and Paeonius de % feso, with reliefs by Skopas (395-350 BC), but without frieze. Tholos de Polycleitus, Epidaurus (350 ECB) circular temple surrounded by 26 speaking columns. Also have 14 internal columns of CORTIO style. For the main sculptors of the IV BC, see: Lysippos (C.395-305 BC), official sculptor for Alexandre The Grande, and Praxitelles (Active 375-335 BC), famous for its CNDUS Aphrodite. The Philipeion, Olympia (339 ECB) Tholos Ionic Building, surrounded by 18 Ionian-style columns and 9 internal corinal columns. Designed by the architect and sculptor Leoachares (4th BC), was erected to celebrate Philip II of Macedon, the father of Alexander, the Great. Temple of Athena Pulleys, Priene, Sia Minor (334 ECB) Temple Ionico Hexastyle Peripteral designed by Pythius of Priene. As the temple of Artemis in is feso, he had no frieze. Temple of Artemis, Sardis, SIA Minor (325 ECB) Temple of Octastyle IÁ 3, one of the biggest temples of the smaller SIA, was unfinished and completed by the Romans. Temple of Dionship, Teos, Minor Sia (193 ECB) Hexasty Stiple Ionian Temple designed by Priene Hermogenes Architect. Apollo Didymaeus Corinthian Temple, Miletus, Minor (310 ECB - 40 EC) Ionic Dipteral Decky Temple with Corinthian features, designed by Greek architects Paeonius of Miletus feso and daphnis. Temple of Olympian Zeus, Athens (174 BC) One of the largest Temples of Octastyl dilidades, was designed by the Ossutius architect. Some of his columns were taken to Rome before the temple ended and incorporated into the Temple of JÁ^opiter Capitolinus, where they had a great impact on Roman architecture. Ancient Greek architects few biographic details are known about the greatest Greek designers. While we know some of their names, and some of the buildings designed, we do not know almost anything about their training, or the extension of their careers.
