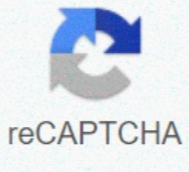




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Prayer for strength and wisdom at work

The prayer authorized by the American Reinhold Niebuhr the prayer of serenity is a prayer written by the American Tein Reinhold Niebuhr [1] [2] (1892 - 1971). It is commonly quoted as: God, grant me the serenity to accept things that I can not change, courage to change the things I can, and wisdom to know the difference. [1] Niebuhr's prayer originally asked for courage first, and specifically to change things that must be changed, not the things that can simply be changed: Father, give us courage to change what should be changed, the serenity to accept what can not be helped, and the perception of knowing the other. [1] The prayer has spread rapidly, often without attribution Niebuhr, through church groups in the 1930s and 1940 and was adopted and popularized by annial alcohols and other twelve-step programs. Niebuhr used it in a 1943 sermon in the church of Heath's Evanger's Union in Heath, Massachusetts. He also appeared in a niebuhr sermon in the praying book and services of 1944 for armed forces. The best known form is a late version, since it includes a reference to the grace not found before 1951: [1] God, give me a grace to accept with serenity things that can not be changed , courage to change things that should be changed and wisdom to distinguish from another: Living one day at a time, enjoying a moment at a time, accepting difficulties as a path to peace, taking, as Jesus did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have, trusting that you will do all the right things if I surrender to your will, so that I can Reasonably happy in this life, and supremely happy with you forever in the next.
